Who loves toys?





History

Willow class will journey back in time to learn all about toys of the past. They will consider the toys their families and communities would have played with historically. The children will make comparisons with toys they and their friends and families play with today. The children will look at toys from other cultures and make observations and ask questions about them.

DT

Willow class will develop their cutting skills and create their own paper toy. They will investigate different paper toys, practise cutting with scissors and experiment using different types of papers. Finally they will evaluate the toy they create.

Science Everyday Materials

Willow Class will identify, name and sort materials – and learn about their properties. They'll distinguish between an object and the material from which it is made, and apply their reasoning as they compare a variety of everyday materials according to the properties they identify through scientific exploration.

English

Willow Class will first be reading a variety of traditional tales to develop their understanding of narratives. The children will be retelling their own version of the story Lost in a Toy Museum and Goldilocks and the 3 Bears. The children will explore the features of a non-fiction text and write their own description of a toy!

- understand what algorithms are; how they are implemented as programs on digital devices; and that programs execute by following precise and unambiguous instructions
- create and debug simple programs
- use logical reasoning to predict the behaviour of simple programs
