



All Things Wild and Wonderful



As **Artists** Willow class will think about their favourite colours and the colours that are all around them every day, before looking at how colours are used in art. They will learn about primary colours, secondary colours, colour mixing, and light and shade, as well as look at the artwork of artists who use colours in interesting ways, namely Kandinsky and Mondrian.



RE

As philosophers, we will learn all about special books of three major world religions. We will find out about the Torah, the Bible and the Qur'an before exploring why they are important for Jews, Christians and Muslims. We will learn about the key features of the books, why they are important and explore some of the teachings included in them



English

As writers we will be writing a narrative based on the book Wild by Hawaiian artist Emily Hughes all about a child who has known nothing but nature. The children will be writing a letter in role as a character who goes on the journey from the popular text Where the Wild Things Are. Finally the children will be writing poems shape poems based on the text Apes and Zebras.





Computing

As computer scientists the children will be programming their own digital device or an on screen robot. The children will learn to:

- Give simple instructions to control a device.
- Use trial and error when programming.
- Name digital devices that need precise instructions to work.
- Use some basic computing terms, such as, algorithm, sequence.
