



All Things Wild and Wonderful


Art

As artists Willow class will focus on painting. They will begin their journey looking at art from Wassily Kandinsky . The children will learn a variety of ways to draw lines and join one to another. They will create patterns using pencils and wax crayons. They will then begin to experiment with painting and creating different images using a varieties of brushstrokes. They will go on to learn about the famous artist Paul Klee, imitating his techniques to create their own piece of art.



English

As computer scientists the children will be programming their own digital device or an on screen robot. The children will learn to:


- Give simple instructions to control a device.
