# **Christmas Fair**

#### Bottle tombola

There will be a mufti-day on Friday 5th December for children to bring in their donations of bottles for the bottle tombola. This can be alcoholic, non-alcoholic or bottles of beauty product, bath foam etc Any alcoholic bottles will be taken from the school reception on Friday 5th and not stored on the school property.

## Toy Tombola

This year in order to distribute the responsibility for collections for the toy tombola, each class will be responsible for collecting their own class donations. This is because the toy tombola has always proved to be a very time consuming and labour intensive task for the class responsible for the stall but it is worth continuing with it as the children enjoy it and it raises a lot of

money.

From now on, although one class will be responsible for setting up and running the stall on the day (Rhino class for the Christmas Fair), each class will be responsible for collecting, sorting and storing their class donations in advance.
