The Funsense leaders transformed the Centre's classroom into a storytelling and craft tent and then led the children onto the nature trail where they discovered some of the unique features of this microcosm of Richmond Park.

**Isabella Open Days** Once again we took over a corner of the Isabella Plantation for two days in August and, in spite of a lot of rain the first day, the team of Centre volunteers welcomed and entertained children with art lessons, "frog spore" creation and, above all, storytelling by volunteers from the Richmond Library.

The additional needs include autistic spectrum disorder, Down's syndrome, hearing or visual impairment, cerebral palsy and developmental delay. # Dame Esther Rantzen entertains and inspires at a Wimbledon tea in support of the Holly Lodge Centre

Centre supporters heard a heart-warming - and at times, amusing -- presentation by Dame Esther Rantzen at a tea party in Hotel du Vin in Wimbledon on 28 September. Many knew of Esther's work in setting up ChildLine, the free 24-hour counselling service for children which has been replicated in many other countries and has helped millions of children and young people deal with issues such as child abuse, bullying, mental illness, parental separation or divorce, pregnancy and substance misuse. Fewer people were aware of Silver Line, a charity spearheaded by Esther for older people who often feel lonely, abused and in need of support. Anecdotes told by Esther of how older people and children have been helped by these two charities brought a tear to many eyes.

Esther began her talk with stories from her early years at the BBC. She and Adrian Mills, a Patron of the Centre, shared amusing incidents of their work together on "That's Life". Esther's speech climaxed



with her recalling funny incidents of her life in showbiz with friends such as Joan Collins, before she left the tea to rush to the Grosvenor House Hotel for the ITV Pride of Britain awards, while guests, still laughing, piled into their cream cakes and scones. It was a very pleasant afternoon, which raised £1000 for the Centre.
