

How long is a piece of string?! When becoming a school governor at Kew Riverside, we undertake a commitment of four years. The logic behind this is that it takes one year to familiarise yourself with the workings of each committee, the mandates from the DfE, the Local Authority, and the various educational authorities, the policies and the acronyms, of which there are many. For the remaining three years a governor will become increasingly able to understand how best to use their own skills and to truly deliver value and act as a critical friend of the school.

We all undertake regular training which is provided via the Local Authority, better known as Achieving for Children (AfC) and is delivered for schools in Richmond and Kingston. This training covers all areas pertinent to governors: safeguarding, financial management, challenging effectively, special educational needs, health and safety, to name but a few. It is provided free of charge and it is a very important part of any governor's role to sign up and attend these courses.
