Dear Parents and Carers

KewZania

Once again, a big thank you for all the adult help last Friday at KewZania. The JLT did a brilliant job in planning the event from start to finish and the feedback from many has been extremely positive.

Parking Safely

Please do not drop children at the school gates or park in any of the zones around the Townmead Road entrance. I have already spoken to at least two parents this week about dangerous parking. Please do not put your own or other children's lives at risk in order to be on time. Leave home a little earlier and live a little longer!

Incident near School

Be aware that criminal gangs on mopeds are still operating in the area and targeting people for their phones. Please be aware of your surroundings when on your mobile and keep any handbags secure to your person. Report any incidents to police and call 101 if you see any suspicious activity.

Attendance and Punctuality

A reminder that the attendance target for each pupil at Kew Riverside is at least 96%. If a child's authorised or unauthorised absences cause their attendance to fall below 90%, this will be identified as 'persistent absenteeism'. To put this into context, 90% attendance over the school year is equivalent to missing a month of school. We have a legal obligation to inform the Local Authority Educational Welfare Service of any persistent absenteeism on a termly basis and we may ask parents/carers for written confirmation of medical appointments/diagnoses etc in the form of hospital letters/appointment cards/texts. Please also ensure that your child is ready to enter their classroom at 8.50am when the doors open to avoid being late. For further details please refer to our Attendance policy on the website.

Parents Phonics Workshop

We will be running a phonics workshop for parents/carers of children in Giraffes, Zebras and Elephants on **Tuesday 27th November**. During the session we will go over how we teach phonics at Kew Riverside and how you can support your child with their phonics at home. We will run the same workshop at **9.15am** and **3.30pm**. The workshops will last for approximately 30 minutes. Please sign up in the office if you are interested in attending.

Signup for Parents' E-Safety Talk

We have arranged for Peter Cowley, ICT and Online Safety Adviser, to give a parent talk on E-Safety on 20th November at 6.30pm. Those of you who have attended this before will know how useful it was in informing us of the dangers of the online world but also, to not panic and be able to set guidelines and protection in place. We hope as many of you can attend as possible.

20isPlenty

The 20isPlenty campaign will be coming to our school during Road Safety Week on Tuesday 20th November. Although this is predominantly about speed, we are hoping to use this opportunity to raise the parking issues we have experienced.

Love in a Box

This year, we will once again be supporting a charity known as 'Love in a Box'. The charity collects shoeboxes filled with small gifts and delivers them to children in Eastern European countries who are from poor families or who are hospitalised or living in orphanages, and who would not usually receive gifts for Christmas. All you have to do is cover a shoe box with some bright paper or decorations and put in a mixture of basic things like toothbrushes, warm gloves, sponges or soaps and small gifts such as coloured pencils, skipping ropes, books or puzzles. If you feel that you are able to donate a box of small gifts (they need not be expensive), please return your 'Love in a Box' shoebox to the office by **Monday 19th November**. There is a leaflet in the children's book bags, tear off the slip and return it with your filled shoebox indicating the age and gender you are wishing to donate to. The boxes should only be sealed with an elastic band as all contents in boxes are checked, for security reasons, before leaving the country. Thank you for your support and generosity in giving to this very worthy cause.



Last problem's solution: Bev's Dice


For the stack in question we can think of there being two types of dice. The base dice and the top die as shown on the right.

If you experiment with stacks of four dice you will find that, since you can only see four faces on a base die, the spots on each base die sum to 14, regardless of how you stack it. This is because there are two pairs of opposing faces whose spots sum to 7.

However, the top die has five faces exposed. Like the dice below it, the four outer faces will always sum to 14. Therefore, you can choose to orientate the top dice however you wish and the sum of the spots of that die will always be 14 plus the number of spots on the top face. Since you want to maximise the sum, you should choose 6 spots to be on the top face.



Therefore, the total sum for the stack of four dice is:
