Adding the River




Choose blues, greens, white and silver. Try layering different materials, e.g. wool over fabric.

Remember the streams on the high ground are fast and narrow. The lower course will be wide and meandering. You can use lots of different materials to add the river to your background, e.g. wool, tissue paper, shiny paper, fabrics or even cling film or plastic bags.



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What river features should you show?





Trees can be drawn on green paper with crayons and cut out as they are or they can be made by sticking collage materials onto card.

Make boats, houses, farms, tractors, shops, cafes, people, animals, etc. by cutting out shapes from coloured paper, card and textured materials, also use paint or crayons to add detail.





You can make some lifelike rocks by sticking scrunched-up kitchen paper into rock shapes and painting them with a mixture of paint and PVA glue.



These rocks were painted with dappled brown, black and white.
