

What is a volcanic eruption really like?

Task:

Create and perform a volcanic eruption, accompanied by a commentary in the style of David Attenborough.

Method:

Use the sheet 'How to represent a volcanic eruption through dance/music' and watch the video clip to give you some ideas and inspire you.

Think about what happens when a volcano erupts and act out the build up to the eruption and the actual eruption. Draw on knowledge from previous weeks and all you know about volcanoes and volcanic eruptions.

Plan and perform a commentary on the build up to the eruption and the eruption itself in the style of David Attenborough.

If possible, record your performance and upload it onto seesaw.

You can choose one of the ideas or you may want to do all 3. If the dance and music element doesn't inspire you then just complete the David Attenborough commentary. You may find a clip of a volcanic eruption online and you can record yourself giving a commentary of this.

Things you may need:

Think about adding props into your dance performance for added detail. You could use musical instruments or items around the house which would give the same sound effects. Strips of chiffon or other light material in reds, oranges and yellows would be a great addition. You could even use larger pieces of material like sheets in fire colours for added drama.
