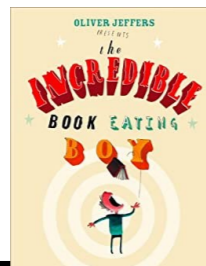
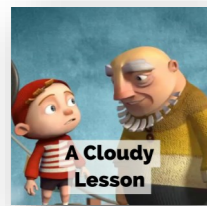




Animal magic

English

As authors we will be writing instructions based on the Literacy Shed video short story A Cloudy Lesson. We will then be studying the text, The Incredible Book Eating Boy, a story all about a boy who eats books instead of reading them! The children will be writing letters to him to persuade him to stop eating them. Finally, the children will create their own narratives based on the book Leaf by Sandra Deickmann.



Art

As artists Cherry Tree class will be immersed in **collage**. The children will use a combination of materials and explore how mixing these can create texture. Children will use folding, clumping, tearing and overlapping to create their images. Children will explore using shapes and how to arrange these to create a variety of a manners. Children will look at work from Henri Matisse and Rita Greer to inspire their collage work.

Science

As scientists we will be identifying and naming a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. Also, we will identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense. Finally, we will be recognising that animals, including humans, have offspring which grow into adults.

Computing

As **computer scientists** the children will be programming their own digital device or on screen robot.

The children will learn to:

- Give simple instructions to control a device.
- Use trial and error when programming
- Name digital devices that need precise instructions to work.
- Use some basic computing terms, such as, algorithm, sequence.

Trips

As **explorers** we will be visiting The Holly lodge Centre in Richmond Park to take part in a science workshop all about Living Things in Winter. Cherry Class will learn all about how the natural world prepares itself for the harsh conditions of Winter.

As philosophers we will be take part in a World Religion day where we learn all about the 6 faiths and the humanistic views.

Following this, we will learn all about Buddhism; including who Buddha was and the teachings of how to live their lives.

Maths



As **Mathematicians** we will:

- Count to and across 100, forwards and backwards, beginning with zero or 1, or from any given number.
- Identify and represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line, and use the language of: equal to, more than, less than (fewer), most, least.

- Solve simple problems in a practical context involving addition and subtraction of money of the same unit, including giving change
