Dear Parents and Carers

Time to celebrate! It is with great pleasure that I can announce our SATs, Phonics and EYFS results for 2018-19.

In KS2, Kew Riverside's (KRPS) score exceeds national results in all areas. This is an excellent result.

The 'Floor Standard' is a Government determined national target that states how many children per year group are anticipated to achieve the expected level of learning (EXS) for their age group in core subjects. The Floor Standard for Year 6 this academic year was set at 65%. There is also a higher, greater depth standard (GDS).

As a one-form entry school, each of our children represents 3.3% (assuming a class of 30). Children who are new to the school and/or learning English as a new language, or have special needs are not assessed but are included in the cohort size. So if, for example, three children in a class of 30 fall into these categories, that can impact results by 10%. For example, in Year 2 we have had nine children join us since Reception. I hope this helps provide context for this year's results.

Please also note that these results provide a measure of the pupils' <u>attainment</u> against the target; they do not provide a measure of the <u>progress</u> made by the pupils, each of whom has a different learning journey. Therefore the results provide only a partial picture of what each child has achieved. All of the children are on a learning journey and we are confident that their progress indicates higher levels of attainment can be achieved going forward.
