## Acting Headteacher's Message



Dear Parents and Carers,

What a week! Never have primary schools had so much attention in the national press...

As no doubt you are aware, the government has announced that schools <u>may</u> reopen to Reception, Year 1 and Year 6 children from 1 June. This is in addition to those children who are already eligible for a school place in other year groups.

We have started the complex process of risk assessing the school, looking at the use of indoor/outdoor space; staff allocation; increased cleaning procedures; staggered pick up/drop off times and many other considerations. Our absolute priority is to ensure that Kew Riverside is as safe **and happy** an environment as it can possibly be before re-opening.

We would very much welcome your involvement in this risk assessment process. For this reason, it would be very helpful for you to read through the following government guidance (I can't guarantee it will be the best bedtime reading you have ever had!):
