Dear Parents and Carers

Welcome back to school! We are all very excited about the year ahead; not least the chance to enact some of the changes to areas that we feel will enhance the quality of the children's learning from day one.

Behaviour in the school and the safety of your children is a priority for us every year. At the end of the summer, we rewrote the Behaviour Policy and a flowchart is attached which summarises the stages we now go through as a staff when behaviour falls short of our expectations. I have explained these stages to the children in this week's assembly.

We are asking for voluntary donations from parents of children in years 1-6 of £5 to cover your child's stationary for the year. This will provide your child with a pencil case and its contents. We are hopeful that this will help your child to understand that our learning tools are not throwaway items and that by taking care of these tools they are always ready and able to learn. Any donations can be made directly to the office. Thank you.

We are also allowing all-black trainers as part of the school uniform as an alternative to shoes. These trainers must not have other colours such as stripes, 'swooshes', images or lights! A picture list of acceptable trainers was sent out during the holidays by Parentmail but can also be viewed on the website.

The curriculum timetable, as I am sure you understand, is a complex structure. As with other schools, there are many pressures in covering all our subjects adequately. Following a review, I have decided to end Friday afternoon 'options'. Instead, 'Forest Schools' will play a greater part in the science curriculum across the school. We are looking into alternative arrangements for swimming practice for the gala.

Welcome back to school! I'm looking forward to a very musical year ahead. In addition to class music lessons, don't forget the other musical opportunities on offer:

Kew Riverside Singers: our choir will be rehearsing every Friday from 12:00-12:30 starting the 16th (children head to the hall for lunch directly after). It is available to all children in Key Stage 2, and children are expected to commit on a termly basis. In addition to school performances we will also prepare for concerts in other venues, such as Kew Sparkle and Richmond Music Trust's singing festival.

Right on Kew Orchestra: our orchestra will rehearse Wednesdays from 12:00-12:30 starting the 21st (children head to the hall for lunch directly after). It is available to all instrumentalists at a grade 1 or higher level, with brass players welcome as soon as they start small group/individual lessons with me. Please sign up with Lisa with name and instrument so I can make sure I have the right parts for our first rehearsal. Children are expected to commit on a termly basis and we will be pursuing several exciting performance opportunities.

Music Lessons: Children are encouraged to sign up for music lessons. We currently offer lessons for: Piano, Violin, Drum kit, Guitar, Brass and *Singing.

For piano children can learn in small groups with Richmond Music Trust,
