

Governors - What are our background and skills?

Every year we perform an internal audit of the skills of the governing body. This allows us to ensure we have expertise across a variety of areas and can address any shortfalls or gaps.

In line with our constitution, we are able to recruit new governors when a vacancy is available to fulfil specific requirements. This helps support the head teacher and the senior leadership team to the best of our abilities.

At present we have a fairly comprehensive set of skills in the current governing body: finance and audit, business management, health and safety, psychology and counselling, communications, ICT and computers, project management, human resources and recruitment, and data analysis.

We currently have two parent governors (elected by parents), nine coopted governors (of which five are parents, four with no KRPS association), a staff governor (elected by staff), the head teacher, and an associate governor (also a member of staff). The Local Authority governor position is currently vacant. We have an official clerk who takes minutes at meetings and coordinates dates and communications between everyone; this is a paid position.
