Developing the Outside Area - The Field

Plans to develop the first phase of the field, the Horticultural Area, are all set.

We have contacted many different groups of people with various degrees of expertise and are confident of forming a strong group of volunteers going forward. Our next step before building the area is a meeting with the PFI, the owners of the school premises, to discuss what we can and cannot do regarding changing the fixtures of the field area. Once agreed, we will have the go-ahead to buy resources and organise labour to construct the garden before the end of spring. I will be sending out some dates when we will open the field gates for donations of various items, such as:

- Tools (spades, shovels, forks, handforks, trowels, rakes, etc.
- Old wellies to fit 4, 5, 6 year olds.
- Wet suits or jump suits to fit 4 and 5 year olds. Also kagools, rain hats, ponchos (waterproofs)
- Wooden sleepers (treated)
- Half bags of compost or top soil
- Old tyres, bricks (not rubble please!)
- Plants, seeds, pots, tubs, planters, watering cans, canes, string, etc.

We will also plan an open morning one weekend to invite the community along to help with planting.

Improving Parental Engagement

The school are always open to feedback from you and we strive to improve our school for the children and their families and for the staff. As I have mentioned previously, we do not have the size of budget of other schools in the area but it is managed very well and we do not waste public funds. Recently, following feedback, the school arranged for Gill Hines to visit us to give a Relationships and Sex Education talk on 8th February. We have also booked a Maths consultant to speak to parents on 7th March. These events cost a lot of money, which the school covers. However, at present, numbers signed up for the SRE talk total 8 and the number of confirmed attendees for the maths talk is 1. We have also moved meeting times to later slots and made a commitment to improve communication through a variety of media. In the past 2 years, internet safety events, curriculum evenings and assessments evenings have all been poorly attended. As we appear to not be succeeding in this area, I would appreciate your views on such events in future. One answer could be not to book specialist speakers until we can cover the cost by charging you in advance. I hope it does not come to this. I know that many of you work long hours, and do not even get to see your own children some days, but there must be a way of informing you in future and sharing school

information face to face.
