- Be suspicious of all 'too good to be true' offers and deals.
- Don't agree to offers and deals immediately. Take time to get independent/legal advice.
- Don't handover money or sign anything until you have checked the credentials of the company/individual.
- Never give banking or personal information to people you don't know or trust.
- Always log on websites directly, rather than clicking on links provided in emails.
- Don't rely on glowing testimonials; find independent advice.
- Always get independent, legal advice if an offer involves money.
- Report a scam to Action
 Fraud on 0300 123 2040 or online, actionfraud.police.uk.
 Contact police if the suspect is known and still in the area.
 Don't be embarrassed to report a scam; criminals are cunning and there is no shame in being deceived.
