

Puzzle of the Week - Solution next week!

Snakes and ladders



Your counter is on 9.

You roll a 1 to 6 dice.

After two moves you land on 16.

Find all the different ways you can do it.

Now think of other questions you could ask.

Last Week's solution: Rae's Phones

One way of thinking about this puzzle is that there is 240 minutes of charging needs to be done (4 phones x 60 minutes). As Rae can charge three phones at a time we divide 240 by 3 to get the fastest she can charge all her phones: 80 minutes.

However, it is not instantly obvious how it is possible to charge all four phones in that time. Below is a diagram where the four phones are labeled A, B, C and D.

Charger 2	В	В	D	В
Charger 3	С	D	С	С

In the solution above all four phones are given 60 minutes in total and the total time taken (as shown along the top is 80 minutes). We know this is an optimal solution because all three chargers are constantly in use and so it is impossible to charge the phones any faster.
