Children's Mental Health Day

Following the success of last years 'Be Yourself' day we will once again be taking part in Children's Mental Health Day. This year's theme is 'Love Your Body, Love Your Mind' and aims to encourage children to stay healthy inside and out. We will be taking part in this on Thursday 14th February. As this is also St Valentine's Day, we are asking children to **come to school dressed in red or pink** to represent love! We will be spending some time in class looking at how to keep our bodies and minds active and healthy with different exercise and mindfulness activities. The children do not need to pay any money towards this day.

<u>Parents Coffee Morning – PATHS and Social Emotional Intelligence</u>

On Wednesday 6th March we are inviting all parents and carers to a coffee morning at school to talk about the new PATHS scheme we are currently running with the children. PATHS stands for 'promoting alternative thinking strategies' and is linked to the social and emotional aspects of learning. Tess Sullivan, our PATHS school coach, will lead the session on how PATHS works within the curriculum, what is social and emotional learning and what are the effects of children who don't develop this. She will also speak about children's feelings and using self control techniques at home to build better relationships. The session will be straight after drop off at 9am – 10am in the school hall. Mental Health Policy

I am in the process of drafting a Mental Health Policy for the school.
