It aims to develop intrapersonal skills, interpersonal skills, adaptability, stress management, general mood and life skills.

Parental support is crucial for the children to achieve all of their 'Moments of Triumph' over the course of the year so we look forward to getting you involved! After the half term break you will have a Moments of Triumph target card to keep at home so you know what your child is working on. There will be time dedicated in school to ticking off some of the targets and lots of rewards to earn such as non-uniform day vouchers, stickers and certificates.

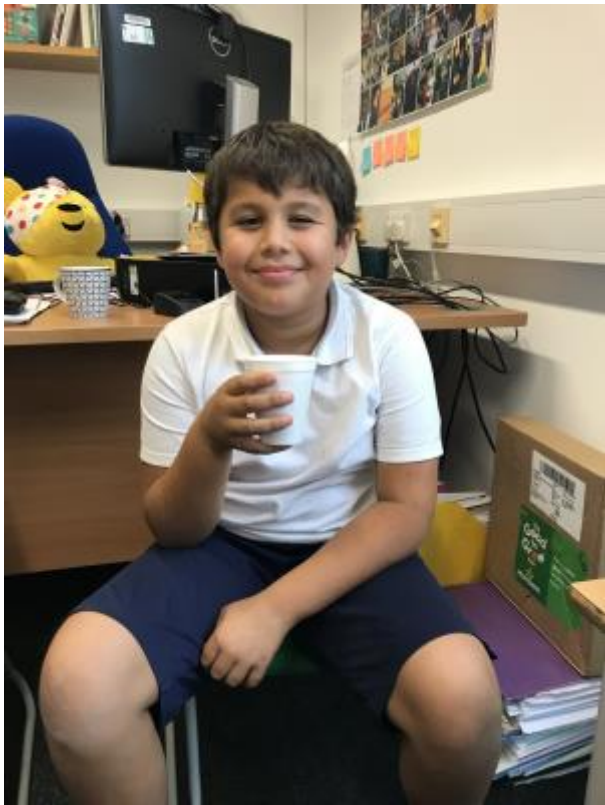

Reporting to the Governing Board, the ideal candidate will work effectively with the Chair of Governors, The Head Teacher and all other Governors.

Possessing a passion for organisation, excellent communication and ICT skills and an enthusiasm for process, the clerk will be able to:

- facilitate the smooth running of the Governing Board;
- manage all required administration duties relating to meetings, policies, record keeping; and
- provide procedural and legislative advice to the Governing Board.

This role (estimated 280 hours over the academic year) is perfect for a motivated self-starter wanting to be involved in a dynamic and unique school setting and gain exposure to strategic leadership and development in Education.

Covering full Governing Board and committee meetings throughout the academic year during term time, the clerk would be required for a total of between 14-18 meetings (usually held on Wednesday or Thursday evenings from 6:30-8:00pm).
