



Kew Riverside Primary School: 2018 Parents & Carers Survey

We set out below the results of the 2018 Survey, based on the 21 responses received.

The survey questions are the same as those used in 2017; firstly key questions Ofsted monitor and then questions we asked in 2017.





Finally you were asked whether you would recommend KRPS to another parent or carer; about 95% of respondents gave the school a rating of 7 and above (out of 10).
