I strive to inspire children to challenge themselves in PE by providing an engaging and fulfilling curriculum that gives children the opportunity to become physically confident, excel in competitive sport and embed our school values.

Alongside our curriculum delivery with our specialist coach Mr O & BeActive, we provide children with frequent opportunities to participate in competitions, events and games. We offer a wide-range of clubs including boys & girls' football, tennis and dodgeball - with an aim of allowing all children to build upon their learning within lessons.

At Kew Riverside, we place great importance on competition and sporting experiences in PE - we believe these experiences help children to develop their skills and knowledge in different sports and skills, whilst also building their resilience and characters. Throughout the year, children have the opportunity to develop their learning and take part in a range of house and school tournaments and borough-wide leagues in football, hockey, tag-rugby, dodgeball, cricket and multi-sports.

Each year we allow children to take on leadership roles as Sports Leaders. The children coach and lead sports zones in the playground that promote greatly to the sporting ethos at Kew Riverside - building and embedding our school values to all.
